



Established in 2003, the Mentorship Programme aims to enhance the connection between industry leaders, including alumni and other experienced professionals, and current students. We welcome applications from both undergraduate and postgraduate students to encourage early career planning and increase exposure through interactions with mentors from diverse backgrounds.

Programme Objectives

- Provide a platform for mentees to learn from mentors' valuable work and life experiences.
- Help mentees establish useful networks for future development.
- Assist students in identifying their career orientation and goals.

Duration of the Programme

The Mentorship Programme is a **one-year initiative that begins every November**. Mentees are encouraged to maintain contact with their mentors beyond the official programme period, fostering opportunities for lifelong friendships.



Target Mentors

- **Hong Kong-based senior executives or managers with at least 5 years of working experience from various sectors.**
- **Professionals from industries** such as accounting, consultancy, social and community services, NGOs, government, legal, education, journalism, media, information technology, etc.
- Individuals with **extensive social and professional networks**.
- **Passionate** about helping youth and willing to devote time and effort to nurturing the younger generation.

Mentor Recruitment

- Ongoing process throughout the year.
- The matching process primarily considers the **industry preferences of participating mentees**; therefore, some mentors may not be assigned to a mentee every year. They can choose to remain in the mentor pool for future matches.

Programme Format

- An **Opening Ceremony** will serve as the first official gathering for mentors and mentees, typically scheduled for a **Saturday afternoon in November**.
- Mentors and mentees have the **flexibility to decide on their meeting and communication methods**. While there are no strict rules, both parties are encouraged to meet at least four times throughout the year, in addition to regular phone or email communication, to achieve the programme's objectives.
- **Possible formats** include firm visits, experience-sharing sessions, attending business conferences, social functions, enjoying breakfasts or lunches near mentors' offices, engaging in voluntary services together, and allowing mentees to assist in organizing activities.
- Upon completion of the programme, mentors will be recognized by HKSU with a **certificate of appreciation**.
- Mentor-to-mentee ratios can be **1:1, 1:2, or 1:3**.

Our Expectations on Mentors

- **Maintain regular contact with mentees** (minimum of four meetings per year).
- **Commit to nurturing** assigned mentees and report any difficulties or challenges to OSA.
- **Attend the Opening Ceremony** (typically held in November each year).
- **Guide or provide opportunities** for mentees to explore their career interests and follow up accordingly.
- **Submit an evaluation form** of the programme to the Office of Student Affairs.



Advice for Mentoring Relationship

- **Meet in public places**, such as a café, school, library or a windowed conference room at the office.
- **Schedule meetings at appropriate times**. To avoid meeting one-on-one at night, try to meet during the daytime or work hours.
- **Focus on goals and career-related issues**. Make the relationship development specific to the mentee's objective and professional interests.
